Drew Killinger agrees. “It was hot but rainy too in California.”

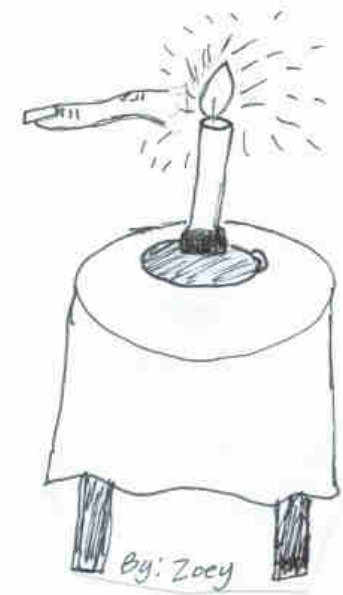
I think we can all agree that it is hot out so remember to wear your sunscreen!

Armbruster only saw it once but she thinks her house is haunted because her china dolls are disappearing one by one.



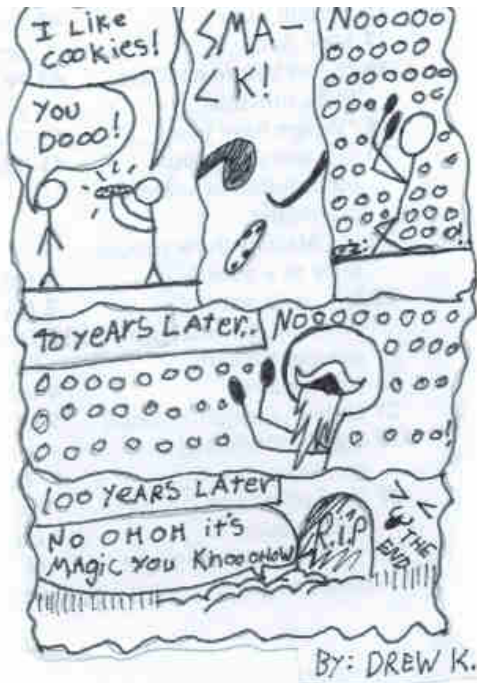
